Comings and Goings in the FAPE Office

Plans are going well for the April 18-20, 2007
Florida Partners in Education Conference,
Winds of Change, St. Petersburg Bayfront. Beef 'O'
Brady's has expanded it's partnership and becomes
FAPE's first Presenting Partner. We celebrate this
opportunity to maximize both organizations' initiatives for community involvement and the support
citizen participation provides student achievement in
this state. In other news:

On February 8, President Judi Miller, President Elect Doretha Jackson and Executive Director Pam Lastowski represented the organization at the Tallahassee press conference that launched the Parent DVDs. FAPE members Lenelle Cruse, Florida PTA president, Susan Walton, DOE, PAEC's Rick Everitt, Paula Waller and Lisa Schofield were also in attendance. This handy tool was created through a partnership among DOE, the governor's office, and PAEC. FAPE was also a partner and participated in supporting the distribution. District Volunteer Coordinators were the brokers for receiving and distributing the DVDs. Three million were made available to Florida's parents. This DVD provides every household with information about academic programs, policy, strategies and resources. The intent is to remove the mystery from education's vocabulary, programs and requirements.

On February 5, FAPE sent a lobby team to visit some key legislators on behalf of a requested appropriation for developing extensive on-line training for volunteers and volunteer program administrators. The appropriation also provides financial assistance to school districts to enhance local training. Further, there would be money available for scholarships to attend statewide in-service opportunities. A draft of the requested legislation is provided here.

Funds in Specific Appropriation 00 will provide to each school district that is eligible, through the Department of Education, an incentive grant of \$5,000 (\$335,000) for the delivery and support of training for volunteers/mentors/business partners. \$150,000 will go to PAEC to provide funding to create new on-line training/statewide delivery of satellite broadcast programs for volunteers/mentors/business partners. Before any funds provided in Specific Appropriation 00 may be released to any public school district volunteer program, the public school district must certify to the Commissioner of Education that this district will participate in the statewide training. \$15,000 will be provided to support the Florida Partners in Education statewide conference by providing stipends, registration and training for volunteer coordinators supporting rural county participation.

Other legislation of interest to many FAPE members is HB 439-Relating to Background Screening of School Volunteers.

HB 439 - Relating to Background Screening of School Volunteers -

General Background Screening of School Volunteers; provides background screening requirements for school & after-school program volunteers with direct student contact at private schools participating in scholarship programs; provides said requirements for school & after-school program volunteers with direct student contact at public schools. Amends 1002.421; creates 1012.466. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2007.




