Region I Winner from Santa Rosa County



Region IV Winner from Lee County



The Panhandle Area Education Consortium and The Florida Association of Partners in education announce Five Star School Award Training. The course is designed primarily for district volunteer coordinators, school volunteer coordinators and school leaders. The content describes the requirements and application process requisite to achieve the prestigious Five Star Award School status in Florida.

Outcomes: School leaders will understand the requirements for achieving Five Star School status and have successfully completed the Five Star School Award application.

Pupil Outcomes: Students will experience benefits resulting from increased parent and community involvement at the school site.

Under the blue FEC tab select **Schedule**. Select **Programs** from the menu. Select **Five Star School Award** from the list, then select the **Schedule** link. **NOTE: Times listed are Central Time Zone.**

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New Volunteer Rate

The Independent Sector announces that the 2006 estimate for the value of a volunteer hour has reached \$18.77 per hour. Such an estimate can be used to help organizations quantify the enormous value volunteers provide. The 2006 estimate increased from \$18.04 per hour in 2005. As volunteer coordinators, we know that our volunteers' time is priceless. However for press release purposes, you can use the rate times the number of volunteer hours to demonstrate the savings to school districts on having volunteers enriching and remediating students.
